

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PARENTS / GUARDIANS

- Parents /Guardians must read this code of conduct and ensure that your child/children understand the code of conduct for young players.
- Ensure proper tennis footwear is worn at all times.
- Any child not in appropriate footwear will not be permitted to participate.
- Deliver and collect child punctually to and from coaching sessions/matches/blitzes.
- Detail any health concerns and / or Report any changes to your child's health to the coach prior to the session.
- Inform coach prior to the lesson if your child has to be collected early and by whom.
- Ensure your child plays by the rules. Focus on best effort rather than performance.
- Behave responsibly as a spectator.
- Show appreciation and support for the coach.
- Be realistic in your expectations for them.
- Ensure your child's hygiene and nutritional needs are met.
- Accept the Official's judgement.
- Acknowledge the importance of the role of the coach and volunteers who often provide their free time to ensure your child / children's participation in sport.
- Promote your child's participation in playing sport for fun.
- Do not ignore or dismiss complaints expressed by a child.
- Do not treat the club as a child minding service.
- Children are their parents' responsibility. If your child needs supervision when using the courts you or a designated adult must attend.
- Children under 8 must have an adult with them.

• Parents/Guardians have the right to:

- Be informed of any concerns relating to their child.
- Be informed if their child is injured during a club organized event.
- Have their consent sought for issues such as competition / trips / fundraising.
- Contribute to decisions within the club.
- Complain if they have concerns about the standard of coaching.

Any misdemeanors and breach of this Code of Conduct will be dealt with immediately by a club official. Persistent concerns or breaches will result in the parent/guardian being instructed not to attend games etc. if their attendance is detrimental to their child or other children's welfare. Continued breach of conduct by a parent/guardian may result in their child's membership being terminated.
